Urge Your Representatives to Support an Increase in H-1B Numbers

Last week the U.S. House of Representatives held hearings concerning the H-1B cap and whether it should be increased. Proponents spoke in favor of the H-1B program as fuel for the U.S. economy and a vital tool for meeting employer needs. Opposition voices alleged abuse of the H-1B program by employers intent on replacing U.S. workers with lower-paid foreign nationals on H-1B visas. Rebut the myth that U.S. business seeks additional H-1B numbers in order to replace higher-paid U.S. workers with more H-1B employees.
