U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR (DOL) ANNOUNCES PLANS TO PROPOSE A FILING FEE FOR PERM APPLICATIONS FOR PERMANENT EMPLOYMENT CERTIFICATION

In a recent report by the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) Employment and Training Administration (ETA) Report on Permanent Foreign Labor Certification, PERM Reforms, and Backlog Reduction, the ETA announced plans to submit a legislative proposal to Congress for the establishment of a fee structure that would permit the DOL to recover the cost of administering the PERM program for Applications for Permanent Employment Certification. The DOL has not yet proposed a fee or confirmed the amount of the filing fee for which DOL seeks authorization.
