Individuals who intend to apply for new or renewed nonimmigrant visas in the coming weeks should consider this opportunity to be accompanied by one of Tindall & Foster’s consular practice specialists. For all trip participants, an experienced immigration attorney will coordinate the travel, screen the applications, prepare the necessary documents, and accompany participants for visa application, re-inspection and admission to the United States.

Interested applicants should contact their Tindall & Foster attorney as soon as possible due to limited availability of visa appointments blocked off for the trip by the U.S. Consulate.

Applicants seeking to apply for new or “renewed” visas during the month of June 2007 should also contact their Tindall & Foster immigration attorney at this time. The dates for the June trip will be finalized in the coming weeks upon confirmed appointment availability at the Consulate.
