An experienced immigration attorney will screen each applicant’s qualifications, thoroughly review each applicant’s immigration history, prepare the necessary documents for visa application, conduct one-on-one attorney-client interviews with each applicant in preparation for the visa interview, and provide legal representation before U.S. Customs & Border Protection (CBP) during the immigration inspection and readmission process.

In preparation for Foster Quan consular practice trips, our consular specialist support staff coordinates client travel arrangements and secures on behalf of each applicant the necessary Mexican authorization to permit qualified applicants to enter Mexico for the purpose of visa application at the U.S. Consulate.

In order to qualify for visa application at one of the U.S. Consulates in Mexico, an applicant must be applying for a new visa of the same type previously issued in the applicant’s home country. U.S. Consulates in Mexico will not accept visa applications from third-country nationals residing in the United States who are subject to NSEERS special registration requirements or who are citizens or nationals of North Korea, Cuba, Syria, Sudan, or Iran. Additionally, applicants with certain prior immigration violations or criminal violations are not generally accepted.
